Dear fellow travelers on the Emmaus road

I am now going to give you a test to determine what era you grew up in. It is a simple test but very telling. It has nothing to do with your eyes (You are obviously able to read this!) or your coordination. It isn't a stress test to determine the condition of your heart. It is a test of your memory.

Simply this – **GIGO**.

Do you have any recollection of what that means?

(HINT - At one time it was THE catchphrase in the world of computers.)

NO, DON'T LOOK DOWN! That isn't fair! Take a minute and try to remember. If you were dealing with computers in this area you will have dealt with the acronym based on this phrase. You shouldn't have been around long enough to have Alzheimer's yet. Well, maybe the beginning stages. (What was my point? Oh, yeah.)

The phrase is

Garbage In, Garbage Out.
