#### From our Co-Spiritual Director

So many of us have heard the story of The Prodigal Son that we take its title for granted without giving it much thought. But I want us to take a fresh look at it from the viewpoint of Our Prodigal God.

What does prodigal mean? "spending resources freely; wastefully extravagant."

That defines the actions of the son in the far country - but God? God spends his grace lavishly, the scribes and Pharisees might say, recklessly.

Think of the story of the Sower and the seed. In Matthew 13 the farmer extravagantly throws the seed over all types of ground in the hopes that some will find a place to take root and grow. Jesus told us this story to show us that God liberally gives His grace to everyone, broadcast prodigally, extravagantly.

There were two groups of people listening to Jesus.

The first were men and women of questionable reputation. They correspond to the younger brother. Like that young man they had at some point left the teachings of their family and followed their own course of self-discovery. Then there was the second group – the Pharisees and religion scholars represented by the elder brother. They studied and obeyed Scripture, worshiped faithfully and prayed constantly. They were offended by Jesus' fellowship with the sinners.

However, their self-righteousness was destroying not only their lives but those around them who needed to know God's grace. Both the religious and irreligious are spiritually lost.

Jesus' answer is to appeal to both brothers, the wayward and the moralist with the freely given, forgiving grace of God. He offers the same appeal today.

We are familiar with the younger son. Let's spend some time on the older brother.

God's loving forgiveness can pardon and restore any and all sin!

The old hymn "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood" says": "The dying thief rejoiced to see that fountain in his day. And there may I, though vile as he, wash all my sins away." NOTHING, not even the most abject repentance can merit God's grace. We can never do enough to earn it. We can never deserve it.

#### That means we can never own it or control it.

It is God's alone to prodigally give to whomever will receive it. The Pharisees and teachers of the Law are challenged with the truth that our Prodigal God CAN FORGIVE and WANTS TO FORGIVE every sin and restore every person.

The elder brother hears a party going on and is at once suspicious – asks a servant what is going on. When the servant tells him that his wayward younger brother has returned and the father is throwing a party for the whole village, the elder son refuses to go in. This is a very public vote of NO CONFIDENCE in the Father's judgement.

In front of all the guests, this prodigal Father leaves the feast to go out to his older son.

He pleads, but his son still refuses to come in. Not only does his son refuse but he is openly rude and insulting. He doesn't address his loving Father as "daddy" or even "father". Instead, he says "LOOK YOU! – how many years," etc. In a society where reverence and respect for elders was the rule such treatment was outrageous. But to a loving father?

#### Why is the elder brother so angry?

The cost. The Father tells the elder son, "all that is mine is yours." That is literally true. Remember that the estate has been divide when the younger son left. That means the fatted calf, and everything spent on the feast was by strict rule the elder son's birthright. And now it's being spent on this wayward son! WHERE IS THE JUSTICE?!

The control. Both sons resented their father's authority and wanted to get out from under it. Neither son at one point loved their Father for who he was. The younger son took his property and left the house, seeking his own way in a far country. On the other hand, the older son, rather than loving and serving his Father for the prodigally loving man he was, built a wall of morality around his heart.

Are we like he was?

You can try to avoid Jesus as Savior by keeping all the moral laws. You believe God "owes you" answered prayers, a fruitful life and a golden ticket to heaven when you die. Morality becomes a means of maintaining your position in the Father's house where you can have what you want.

Jesus may be your helper, your example, your inspiration but he is not your Savior. You are your own Savior.

Now that the Father has prodigally forgiven his younger wayward son, the emptiness, manipulation and gracelessness of the elder son stands revealed.

What the Gospel tells us is that everyone is wrong, everyone is loved, and everyone is called to receive the freely given grace of our Prodigal God; to repent and to change.

Today elder brothers split the world in two – "The good people like us are in and the bad people who cause all the trouble are out." Younger brothers do the same. "" We open-minded people are the answer to the world and those narrow-minded people are the real problem." As they speak you can hear Lennon in the background singing "Imagine".

Jesus says – "The humble and repentant are in and the proud and unforgiving are out."

The only prerequisite for receiving the grace of God we ALL so desperately need is to admit we need it, that YOU need it.

WILL YOU RESPOND AND RECEIVE IT? AND THEN OFFER THAT GRACE TO OTHERS?

A newspaper posed the question "What is wrong with the world?" The great Catholic thinker G.K. Chesterton wrote a brief response; "Dear Sirs. I am. Sincerely yours, G. K. Chesterton."

Do you want to be part of the answer to the world's problems instead of the cause?

Then repent of your own sin and then freely offer grace to others as a true son or daughter so we can all rejoice together in the house of our Prodigal God.
