But there is something about smelling the food cooking on the grill with the windows open in the summertime. I guess it takes me back to my childhood when my dad would cook on the old hibachi grill in our back yard. Back then, we didn't grill out as much as we do now, this was reserved for special occasions like Birthday's, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, and of course Father's Day. Most days we just had hotdogs and hamburgers, for our cookouts, but on Father's Day my dad would grill corn on the cob and barbeque pork chops, that tasted just like the ones at the Clark Co. Fair. My dad was a great grill master that's for sure! He also was a Christian man that tried to live his life just like Jesus; and while I'm pretty biased, I think my dad did a pretty good job! He raised me and my sisters up in the church and made sure that we knew about Jesus' extravagant love for us.

While thinking about my dad, and Father's Day, I am reminded of the story of the Prodigal Son which is found in Luke 15: 11-32. But today I want to focus on another aspect of the story - the welcome home party. It seems like this part of the story is sort of tacked on at the end - Luke writes - "When the older brother came near the house, he heard music and dancing, so he called one of the servants to ask what was going on and the servant replied 'Your brother has come home, and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.""

Now, there is a lot that we can glean from that servants' reply - not only has the father welcomed his wayward, lost, son home, with open arms, but he has begun a celebration. He has gathered his friends, his family, his neighbors, and called them all to a celebration. He has hung banners from the rafters, sent out invitations as quickly as he could. He is serving the best meal; he is offering the best entertainment - all for this son that once was lost but now is found.

Now of course we know that the older brother is a bit annoyed by this display of celebration. He doesn't quite understand why they would celebrate the return of his good for nothing younger brother that had the audacity to ask his father for his share of the inheritance early and then go off and waste it on wild living! And you know the older brother had always done what was right - followed the rules and been the model son. He had helped his father out whenever it was requested - stuck by his father's side did extra work around the family farm, while his brother was off gallivanting around the in the city, and he couldn't even get a small goat to party with his friends. (Sigh) It's just not fair - is it?

Sounds familiar, doesn't it? But here's the thing - and the father makes this one clear - Grace isn't fair. If it was then the younger son would get what he had coming to him. But instead, he gets the warmest of welcomes and a party - he receives the grace of his father. The undeserved, unmerited, love and acceptance of his father. You know, both brothers are loved and welcomed by their father. They are both valued for the different things they bring to the table. Please start praying for this walk, and put it on your calendar to serve wherever you can.



Light refreshments at 6:30 (When Emmaus meets....Emmaus eats!)


Worship, music, Holy Communion, music, 4th Day speaker and more music follows. At Gathering, 7 p.m.
