On March 13, 2020 each of your Springfield Emmaus Board Members received the following e-mail from Vic Neves:

To the Springfield Emmaus Board

It has become increasingly more difficult to fulfill my responsibilities as Community Lay Director in keeping with the Upper Room's Manuals and Covenant, and Springfield Emmaus' Bylaws. After much soul-searching, prayer, reflection, and coming to the conclusion that our style of leadership is no longer appreciated nor desired within Springfield Emmaus, we (Sue and I) will not be accepting any leadership positions in the future.

There is a saying - "Lead, follow or get out of the way". I know when it is time to "get out of the way". Therefore, effective 2 April 2020, I resign as Community Lay Director and I will not be taking on the Leadership Board position.

**There are still positions that need filled on the Springfield Area Emmaus Board. These include Leadership, Agape, Logistics, Newsletter and Treasurer. Their term will begin June 2020. Please be in prayer in how The Lord could use you.**

**Leadership:** The Leadership chairperson is the Community Lay Director from the previous year. The Leadership chairperson assists the Community Lay Director as needed. The Leadership chairperson is also responsible for and chairs the Team Selection Committee.

**Agape:** The Agape chairperson coordinates all the agape that is received and assures that it gets distributed during the walk. This includes the table agape, bed agape, the personal agape and the community agape.

**Logistics Coordinator:** The Logistics Coordinator leads the team that sets up (and later restores) the conference room and the rooms in the building that are used as sleeping areas for the team and pilgrims. The Logistics Coordinator ensures that there are sufficient helpers to clean bathrooms during the walk. The Logistics Coordinator ensures that someone is available to open and lock up High Street UMC for the gatherings.

**Newsletter:** The Newsletter Chairperson compiles the inputs from the Community Spiritual Directors, the Community Lay Director and any others and builds and distributes the monthly Emmaus newsletter via email.

**Treasurer:** The Treasurer is the keeper of the funds and accounts, and is responsible for paying the community's bills. The treasurer also assures that our books get audited by an independent (non-Emmaus-affiliated) person each year.
