

FROM OUR CO-SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Oh, the beauty of Spring! The green grass, budding and flowering trees, blue skies, and fresh air are always welcome after the cold dark winter months. Recently, I saw a child playing with a kite in an empty farm field. The wind was blowing just right and the kite, with its long tail, was soaring higher and higher. It was a beautiful sight to see the child with a big smile on his face as his arm moved about trying to keep the kite from getting away from him. Just seeing this scene unfold before my eyes took me back to a simpler time in my life. - To the days of roller skating with clip-on, key-tightened skates, on the sidewalk in front of my childhood home. Grabbing onto a nearby forsythia bush when I was unable to come to a stop. Falling and getting back up only to fall again! I also loved playing hopscotch, hide, and seek, and jumping for hours with my friends as we played jump rope, in my driveway, singing silly rhymes at the top of our lungs! As a child, I had a lot of fun playing outside in the spring and I think that's why I enjoy this season so much, even today. Spring brings with it a lot of beauty, fond memories, peace, and joy.

It also reminds us of God's promise of renewal, answered prayers, and entire sanctification. Recently, I asked a few of the children that I know, who attend church, what they like to do for fun. Many of them said they like to play video games, soccer, basketball, and other sporting activities. So, I asked them if they had ever flown kites. Some said yes and knew exactly what I was talking about. Others answered no and said that they didn't like kites because they could never get them to fly. Then there were the ones that just looked at me confused. Sadly, these children had never heard of kites, let alone experienced flying one. One of the children asked me to explain what a kite was and how it could fly. So, I did what most people do when they don't know how to describe something, I turned to Google for some help. Now the article that I turned to talked about the lifting force of the wind, the drag force, which is always in the same direction of the wind, as well as the tension created by the line.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and we shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful, Grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy your consolations. Amen

Realizing this explanation was too complicated for an eight-year-old to understand, I turned to God for an answer. I told the children, "Kites are like how God works in our lives. The kite, with its tail, is like Father God, the string is like Jesus who connects us to the Father, and the wind is like the Holy Spirit who keeps the kite flying in motion. Like the kite, we are unable to function without the wind. We need the Holy Spirit to lead us and guide us on our faith journey. Then I added it's all about the wind and it's all about the Holy Spirit!" This seemed to satisfy the questioning child and PHEW, was I ever glad that they received my explanation!

As we look forward to celebrating Pentecost on May 19th, my prayer for all of us is that we will remember the great gift that we have received in the Holy Spirit. Often this part of the Trinity is overlooked and misunderstood. It is the Holy Spirit that helps us in our weakness (Romans 8: 26-27). The Holy Spirit has the power to protect believers so that nothing can take away our salvation (Ephesians 4:30). The Holy Spirit leads us, guides us, and sanctifies us (Matthew 3:11). The Holy Spirit can empower us to choose what will bring us peace and life (Romans 8:5-6). Finally, the Holy Spirit is our personal, advocate (John 14:26) a gift that has been given to us to empower us to continue the great commission, make disciples of Jesus Christ, and bring transformation to our corner of the world. Friends, let us be mindful of the amazing miracle who walks with us and lives in us, every, single, day. Because without the gift of the Holy Spirit, we would be unaware of our need for God and we would miss out on the free gift of grace, as well as God's promise of eternal life.

WHO IS ON THE EMMAUS BOARD, WHAT DO THEY DO?

We're starting a series on this topic this month.

Community Lay Director: Community Lay Director leads the Emmaus board meetings and numerous other needed meetings. They lead the Gatherings and is the primary person who communicates with the Upper Room Ministries through the Area Communicator on all Springfield Area Emmaus walks and other correspondence. The Community Lay Director arranges with High Street for all walks, Gatherings, and board meetings. Kim Bachman will be the new CLD beginning in July. Rick Clark is our current CLD.

Leadership: The Leadership chairperson is the Community Lay Director from the previous year. The Leadership Chairperson assists the Community Lay Director as needed. They are also responsible for the Team selection Committee. This year it is Verna Reed, next year will be Rick Clark.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is the keeper of the funds and accounts. The treasurer also assures that our books get audited by an independent (non-Emmausaffiliated) person each year. Our treasurer is Jennifer Webster.
